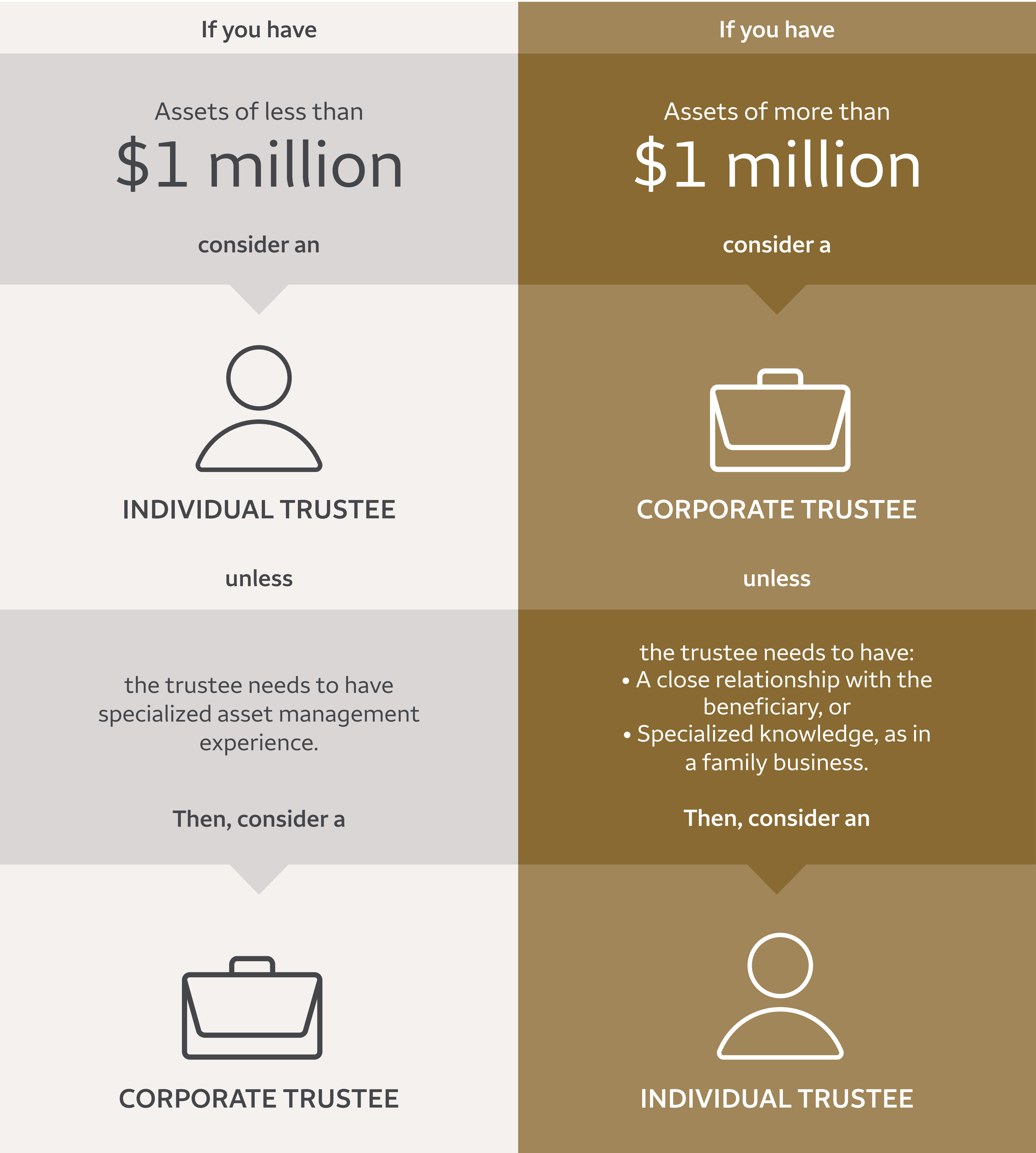


Who should be in charge of your estate?
